Toledo / Lucas County Continuum of Care Homeless Service Providers

Emergency Shelter

In most cases, emergency shelter is the first level of entry that homeless persons access. The goal is to stabilize a person or family in crisis and provide assessment and linkage to other service providers. Referrals are made to transitional and permanent housing providers based on client assessments.

Ten area emergency shelters provide short-term housing:

Transitional Housing

Transitional housing provides long-term temporary housing for those leaving emergency shelter who are not ready to access permanent housing. Most transitional programs serve specific sub-populations such as domestic violence victims, those with substance abuse, ex-offenders and those with a severe and persistent mental illness. Life skills training, parenting, employment assistance, and case management assist clients as they prepare for permanent housing.

Ten transitional facilities provide long-term (up to 24 months) housing:

Permanent Supportive Housing - Housing types vary in their design, promoting a community-based, long-term living setting. The Toledo/Lucas County CoC, through the TLCHB, continues to promote permanent supportive housing.

Neighborhood Properties, Inc. (NPI) provides over 130 units of permanent supportive housing. Several of the projects listed below are in partnership with the Lucas County Mental Health Board. The Pathway to Shelter project is a *Shelter Plus Care* project whose direct grantee is the City of Toledo.

- Families with Mental Illness
- Family w/ Mental IllnessExpansion
- Veterans with Mental Illness
- First Avenue (*serves single women and single men*)
- Pathway to Shelter (*serves single women and single men*)
- PACT Partnership (*serves single women and single men*)
- Fresh Start (*families with children*)
- Housing First (*serves single women and single men*)
- Affordable Housing for Persons with Severe Mental Illness
- A Place Called Home

Lucas County TASC has two permanent supportive housing projects: *Women for Tomorrow* and *Walls for All*, both of which are scattered-site permanent housing providing rent subsidy and services for those leaving correctional facilities.

Family Outreach Community United Services (FOCUS) also offers the community a scatter site permanent housing project, *Steps to Home Permanent Housing*. This project serves the general population.

The YWCA of Great Toledo is another *Shelter Plus Care* grant recipient from HUD. This resource will be used for rent subsidy for its new permanent housing project under development.
