Volunteers of America, <i>Chestnut Hill Project</i>	<b>New Project:</b> New construction - 40 unit apartment building with 16 unites designated to serve the chronically homeless. This is a permanent supportive housing project with service-enriched housing	PH	3	<b>\$420,000</b>
Mental Health & Recovery Services Board, <i>S+C III</i>	<b>New Shelter Plus Care:</b> Rental assistance to 19 homeless mentally ill single adults at scattered apartment sites. Priority is given to chronically homeless. Mental health, substance abuse treatment, and other support services will be provided to participants.	S+C	5	<b>\$590,280</b>
Neighborhood Properties Inc., <i>Good Samaritan Renovation Project</i>	<b>New Project:</b> Provide permanent supportive housing for 6 homeless mentally ill single adults.	PH	3	<b>\$62,337</b>
City of Toledo, <i>Pathway to Shelter</i>	<b>Renewal:</b> Utilizes 15 apartments, with additional unit storage and laundry facilities, within a single apartment complex maintained by Neighborhood Properties, Inc. The units house formerly homeless males and females, 18 years older with little or no income and diagnosed with Severe and Persistent Mental Illness (SPMI).	S+C	1	<b>\$95,400</b>
FOCUS, <i>Toledo HMIS</i>	<b>Renewal:</b> A computerized tracking and data collection system that captures system-wide information about the characteristics and service needs of residents who are homeless. Data notes trends and provides necessary information for planning and oversight.	HMIS	1	<b>\$88,915</b>
Harbor House, <i>Plus Program</i>	<b>Renewal:</b> A transitional housing facility with services for single women who are homeless as a result of alcoholism and substance abuse and who have started a program of recovery. Up to 14 women are able to reside in its 5 bedroom, handicapped accessible, congregate home.	TH	1	<b>\$117,551</b>

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FOCUS, <i>Steps to Home</i>	<i>Renewal:</i> Provides scattered site transitional housing and intensive case management and life skills services to 13 households.	TH	1	<b>\$271,820</b>
FOCUS, <i>Steps to Home I &amp; II</i>	<i>Renewal:</i> Provides leasing and case management for 10 homeless households with several moderate to severe barriers to maintaining housing, including poor (or no) work history, domestic violence, and/or histories of substance abuse and mental health issues.	TH	1	<b>\$119,220</b>
FOCUS, <i>CATCH {Coordinated Assistance to Combat Homelessness}</i>	<i>Renewal:</i> Provides transitional housing subsidy and intensive case management services to homeless families and individuals.	TH	1	<b>\$308,076</b>
Aurora Project, <i>Alternative Sentencing Site</i>	<i>Renewal:</i> Serves women with chronic substance abuse with a history of recidivism, or multiple incarcerations or active involvement in the criminal justice system. Housing includes: 1) 13 beds in a 11-bedroom congregate setting, and 2) 7 step-up units consisting of one bedroom and efficiency apartments, within walking distance of the congregate site. St. Paul's Community Center, <i>Dwelling Place</i>	<i>Renewal:</i> Provides transitional housing and services to chronically homeless individuals who have experienced severe and persistent mental illness (SPMI). Housing: 11 one-bedroom apartments located in a single complex.	TH	1	<b>\$186,811</b>
Neighborhood Properties Inc., (NPI) <i>First Avenue</i>	<i>Renewal:</i> Provides permanent supportive housing for homeless mentally ill young adult ex-offenders. Housing: 12 furnished one-bedroom apartments contained in a single apartment building.	PH	1	<b>\$229,249</b>
NPI, <i>Families with Mental Illness Program</i>	<i>Renewal:</i> Provides permanent supportive housing (24 apartments) containing two or more bedrooms located at scattered sites. The target population is homeless adults diagnosed with severe and persistent mental illness and their children.	PH	1	<b>\$77,676</b>

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NPI, <i>Families with Mental Illness Expansion Program</i>	<i>Renewal:</i> Provides permanent supportive housing in the form of six furnished two-bedroom apartments plus six furnished three-bedroom apartments contained on the first floor of a two story building. The target population is homeless single mothers diagnosed with severe and persistent mental illness and their children.	PH	1	<b>\$90,650</b>
NPI, <i>Fresh Start</i>	<i>Renewal:</i> Provides permanent supportive housing for homeless single mothers with substance abuse and mental health issues and their children. This project utilizes six furnished two-bedroom apartments plus six furnished three-bedroom apartments in one two-story building.	PH	1	<b>\$108,889</b>
NPI, <i>Housing First</i>	<i>Renewal:</i> Provides permanent supportive housing for homeless mentally ill single adults (21 furnished one-bedroom apartments contained in scattered apartment buildings). The target population is single homeless adults diagnosed with a severe and persistent mental illness.	PH	1	<b>\$180,089</b>
NPI, <i>PACT Partnership</i>	<i>Renewal:</i> Provides permanent supportive housing in the form of 14 furnished one-bedroom apartments contained in a single apartment building for homeless mentally ill young adults with a supportive service enriched environment.	PH	1	<b>\$241,752</b>
NPI, <i>Road to Recovery</i>	<i>Renewal:</i> Provides transitional in the form of 17 furnished one-bedroom apartments contained in a single apartment building. The target population is homeless single adult substance abusers coming from the streets, shelters, and treatment centers who lack a sober supportive living environment.	TH	1	<b>\$73,976</b>
